We work with the 5.4 million people in the UK with asthma- we are small but our impact is big! Last year our expert asthma nurse helpline took 7000 calls, covering a wide range of worries and concerns around asthma. 97% of callers said they would recommend our helpline service.

**How your fundraising could help:**

**£15** could cover the cost for a crucial call to our helpline, enabling people to manage their asthma better and reduce the risk of a fatal attack.

**£30** could pay for an hour's specialist training for a nurse, enabling them to be vital source of information for health professionals, teachers, doctors' practices and the general public.

**£240** could pay for the analysis of the specific chemicals involved in one child's asthma, to understand why steroid treatments do not work for them and to work towards medicines that do.
